Advocacy

Become a She Is Safe advocate and multiply your impact for girls most at risk of trafficking and abuse. Advocates dedicate time, energy and resources to speak on behalf of those who are powerless to speak for themselves, making the world aware of the urgent action required to rescue girls from sexual slavery and keep them safe, free and equipped. When advocates form a group focused on an issue and country where She Is Safe works, they gain encouragement and synergy from one another as each person uses their unique gifts and abilities in the work of keeping girls safe, free and equipped.

A She Is Safe Advocate

- Identifies a country/area of focus to raise awareness about in their network/church using their own unique skills and abilities
- Faithfully prays for their country/issue of focus
- Stays up to date on their country/issue of focus through SIS communications to share updates with their network
- Works toward forming a SIS Advocacy group with other people in their church or other circles
- Gives monthly

Ideas to Raise Awareness

- Work with your church to give platform to She Is Safe and our work bringing the transformation of Christ to vulnerable women and girls.
- Host an event to raise funds and awareness. These events can be as simple as a dinner in your home with a few friends or as elaborate as a large crowd in a dynamic event space.
- Host a webinar where a SIS Country Director from your area of focus can share updates, photos and video from the field.
- Crowdfunding through social media networks. SIS can provide more information on this.
- Regularly share about She Is Safe's work on your social media and encourage your connections to follow our accounts.

Advocacy Groups

The most successful advocacy groups are self-sustaining and have a committed core team of 8 to 10 members who meet monthly to bring together their God-given gifts to advance his work through SIS.

Advocacy Group Essentials

- Committed leaders and defined roles
- Self-directed culture
- A faithful prayer base
- A focus on one place/project to raise awareness and funds for
- The ability to boldly and creatively raise awareness, support and prayer in their community
- Partnerships with churches

Advocacy Group Key Roles

- Advocacy Group Leader: schedules regular meetings (monthly meetings are recommended) to keep prayer and ideas flowing and relationships building
- Treasurer and assistant: receives and records all funds for the group and sends them to SIS with appropriate designations.
- Publicity leader: oversees raising awareness through various media outlets and church partnerships
- Secretary: records minutes and action items at meetings
- Prayer leader: plans specific prayer information and focus for meetings and events
- Event leader: spearheads and manages planning events
- Researcher/educator: researches and prepares up-to-date information on issues from the group's country of focus for advocate meetings/events in cooperation with the SIS country director
